



Lions Club License Plate Authorized

Governor Joe Manchin III has approved Senate Bill 183 authorizing a special license plate for Lions Clubs International. However, the legislation requires that the organization obtain a minimum of 100 applications with deposits before the DMV proceeds with the design and production of the special plate.

Each application is to be accompanied by a check made payable to the organization (Lions) in the amount of \$55 to cover the first year's registration fee. This fee includes the annual basic registration fee (\$30), annual additional fee (\$15) and the one-time manufacturing fee (\$10). Applications must be submitted to the Lions and then by Lions to the DMV no later than December 12, 2006. Plates will be issued in sequential order and can not be personalized. Renewals will be processed through the DMV at a fee of \$45 per year.

Lion Clyde Judy Tells of World War II Flying

Lion Clyde Judy introduced the guest speaker, who was Clyde Judy. Judy discussed his flying experiences and the history of air flight. He brought with him models of the B-17, Lockheed's P-38 and the B-34. Judy graduated from the Air Force Cadet program in 1943 and had a choice of flying bombers or fighters. He chose bombers because of the potential to fly commercial airlines after the war. Judy flew the B-34 and crash landed in Rome. He later took a direct hit by a dud shell. In Germany, Judy was at 24,000 ft. and taking flak. He lost co-pilot controls and some of the instrument panel and was hit in the leg. After losing the #2 engine over Vienna, Austria after dropping their bombs, they were on their own with two engines headed for home when they lost #3 engine at Yugoslavia and Judy gave the order to bail out. When he pulled his rip cord, the chute didn't open, but he gave it another very strong pull and out it came. Judy came down in water and swam about 3 hours. during which he prayed. He was picked up by boat and was given artificial respiration. His rescuers kept him in a cave until he was finally picked up by a Navy captain on a sub-chaser. After being hospitalized in Italy for awhile, Judy became a test pilot. After his lungs healed, he flew 10 more missions and headed home. He was an instructor pilot on the B-24.

Members Hear about Habitat for Humanity





At the May 4th meeting, Fairmont Lions Club members heard about the local efforts of Habitat for Humanity. Suzanne Goralczyk with AmeriCorps, described how a family can obtain a home. She explained that the owners are required to put in 400 hours of "sweat equity" and will pay on a mortgage. Goralczyk, who once lived in Michigan, recalled how Lions were always doing things for people and suggested that Habitat for Humanity could become a project for the Fairmont club, as well. In addition to construction work on a home, the club could provide meals to the volunteers, inventory materials, or provide other help to the organization.

In 1999, LCIF began a partnership with Habitat and set aside \$3 million per year for three years to build homes for people with disabilities. In 2001, LCIF committed an additional \$3 million to the partnership. A total of 741 homes have been built or approved for construction so far.
