Wagaman Discusses History of Woodlawn Cemetery

Gena Wagaman, Superintendent of Woodlawn Cemetery, presented a very interesting program about the cemetery at the February 26th Fairmont Lions Club meeting. According to Wagaman, the cemetery, located along Maple Avenue, consists of 42 acres and is home to 15,000 graves dating from 1875. Boaz Fleming and his first wife Elizabeth, among the first permanent settlers in Fairmont, are buried there. Francis Harrison Pierpont, governor of the state of Restored Virginia, and his wife Julia, who is responsible for what is now referred to as Memorial Day, are buried there, also. In addition, the cemetery contains the graves of Pricketts, Morgans and others important in the early history of the area.

The Civil War Trail is providing markers for Woodlawn, the Pierpont house, the Boaz house, and Palatine Park. The cemetery is a National Historic District and eligible for federal grants. When asked what the Lions might do to assist, she indicated that the cemetery needs to be "read", that is, taking photos of the grave markers and writing down what is on them and that the cemetery is in need of new
