

Shelene Warns to Watch for Fraud

F. David Shelene, Field Representative for the Auditor's Office, presented an enlightening program about the dangers to watch from telephone and Internet scams. He spoke to the Lions at the February 23rd meeting. Some of his advice included to never click on an Intenet site link directly from an e-mail message appearing to come from a bank or other "trusted" source. Scammers will

set up web pages that look just like the bank's web page, but instead will just take your bank password and other information and use it to their advantage.

He also recommended going to annualcreditreport.com to see how to order a free annual credit report. The form can also be printed from ftc.gov/credit. Do not use "imposter" sites, as annualcreditreport.com is the only authorized site to fill orders for the free annual credit report you are entitled to under law.

News on Club's Environmental Projects

John Marsicano has ordered 150 West Virginia trees and is coordinating planting locations around Fairmont with the city and with MCPARC. Plans are to involve Boy Scouts in the planting of the trees. Trees will include 100 White Pine, 25 Virginia Pine and 25 Cypress. LCI President Wing-Kun Tam has asked clubs to plant 1 million trees this year and over 6 million have been planted around the world to date.

Coming in April, the club will again hit the trail to clean up trash between Norway and Monongah on the rail trail. Watch for the announcement of day and time. John Marsicano has been leading this effort since its inception.

Lions Around the World Have Planted Over 91/2 Million Trees

2011-2012 International President Wing-Kun Tam challenged Lions around the world to plant one million trees this year to demonstrate the strength of our global network. "I believe that this year we will mobilize Lions around the world to reach this goal and truly make an impact on our environment." As this issue goes to press, 9,633,143 trees have been planted world-wide by Lions. According to the United Nations Environmental Programme, trees are fundamental elements of

various natural systems. They conserve soil and water, control avalanches, prevent desertification, protect coastal areas and stabilize sand dunes. Forests house nearly 90 percent of terrestrial life and are vital centers of biological biodiversity on land.

More than 80 percent of the forests that originally covered the Earth have been lost or degraded. Between 1980 and 1990 alone, the Latin American region lost 62 million hectares (6.0 percent) of its natural forest, which was the largest loss in the world during those years, with a further 5.8 million hectares a year lost between 1990 and 1995. Despite efforts to reverse this trend, deforestation continues at an alarming rate each year, particularly in Africa, Latin America, and Asia and the Pacific. (Source: UNEP)

Over 500 Pairs of Eyeglasses Donated

Measles deaths have dropped by 75 percent in the last decade. Health officials estimate about 9.6 million children were saved from dying of measles from 2000 to 2010 thanks to large vaccination campaigns, according to an article in Business Week.

Last year was the worst year for measles in the United States in 15 years, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). There were 222 cases of measles, up from an average of 60 cases seen in a typical year. Most of these cases were imported — either by foreign visitors or by U.S. residents who picked up the virus overseas, according to an article in USA Today.
