LCI Waives Entrance Fee Through June 30, 2021
The International Board of Directors passed a resolution designed to help clubs as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact the work of Lions around the world, and create financial hardships for Lions and the people for whom we care. All charter and entrance fees have been waived from January 1 through June 30, 2021. Clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will not be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues (Fairmont's dues have already been paid on time for this period.)

Inviting a new member to join before June 30, 2021, will save that

member the one-time \$35 new member (entrance) fee.

2021 Montreal LCI Convention — Attend Without the Travel

The LCI board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal convention to a virtual event held totally online, due to COVID-19. This will be the first virtual international convention and will safely connect Lions from around the world.

• Everyone's invited — the convention will be open to all Lions and

Leos around the world.

 Registration fees — The registration fee will be \$50 until March 31, then \$75 beginning April 1. The convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29.

Elections — Elections will be electronically conducted.

Keynote Speaker on Monday, June 28, will be Malala Yousafzai, a young woman who survived an assasination attempt and became the youngest Nobel Peace Prize Laureate. Yet, she does not consider herself extraordinary.

She began her campaign for girls' education at age 11 with her anonymous blog for the BBC, Diary of a Pakistani Schoolgirl, about life under the Taliban. Then she began advocating publicly for girls' education, joining her activist father on his visits to neighboring villages to recruit for the school. While he spoke to the men, she spoke to the women. Due to her increased prominence, at age 15 she was attacked by the Taliban for speaking out. She recovered in the United Kingdom and has continued her fight for girls, co-founding the Malala Fund with her father in 2013. At ate 17, Malala received the Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of her efforts to see every girl complete 12 years of free, safe, quality education.
