CIVIC IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE PROGRAM:

VAUGHN PENDER SHOWED THE LIONS CLUB THE NEW SIGNS THAT WILL BE USED TO SHOW THE NAME OF THE CITY STREETS WHICH ARE 4 INCHES

HIGH AND OF A GREEN REFLECTOR TYPE WITH LETTERS THAT CAN BE SEEN BECAUSE DUE TO THE SIZE OF THE MARKER AND WILL BE 7 OR MORE FEET HIGH ON 2 INCH PIPE EMBEDDED IN CEMENT, SOME MAY BE SLIGHTLY HIGHER DUE TO THEIR BEING MOUNTED ON STEEL STREET LIGHT POLES. THE SIGN OR MARKER WILL BE PLACED IN A PLACE WHERE IT CAN BE SEEN CLEARLY AND HIGH ENOUGH TO BE OUT OF THE WAY OF BEING DAMAGED BY TRAFFIC. TRAFFIC LIGHT SYSTEM FOR FAIRMONT IS GOVERNMENT PLANNED AND IS SO OUTLINED SO AS TO BE IN CONFORMITY WITH ALL OTHER CITIES IN THE U.S.A. SO THAT ANYONE GOING TO ANOTHER CITY WILL KNOW THAT THEIR TRAFFIC LIGHTS WILL BE OPERATED THE SAME AS IN FAIRMONT. THIS BRINGS US TO ANOTHER ANNOUNCEMENT:

DUES IN ARREARS:

DUES WERE PAYABLE JANUARY 1ST 1974 AND IT IS NOW 90 DAYS LATER. THE STATE AND INTERNATIONAL ASSESSMENTS ARE PAYABLE THEN ALSO AND THE AMOUNTS ARE BASED ON THE REPORTED MEMBERSHIP OF THE CLUB. OUR CLUB PROMPTLY REMITS THE AMOUNT DUE TO STATE AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS. IT LOOKS LIKE IT IS TIME TO GET OUT THE AXE AND TRIM OUT SOME OF THOSE IN ARREARS. THERE IS NO ONE IN OUR CLUB WHO CANNOT HAVE HIS DUES PAID WITHIN 60 DAYS. (IF FOR ANY REASON HE WILL BE LATE IN THE PAYMENT OF HIS CURRENT DUES-BY CHECKING WITH THE TREASURER IT CAN BE SEEN TO THAT ADDITIONAL TIME CAN BE ALLOWED) THE CARRYING OF A MEMBER FOR A PERIOD OF 6 MONTHS OR MORE SHOULD BE DISCONTINUED. TIME HAS SHOWN US THAT THOSE WHO ARE CONTINUALLY IN ARREARS USUALLY LEAVE US HOLDING THE BAG SO TO SPEAK AND WE ARE OUT THE AMOUNT OF THEIR PAST UNPAID DUES. THE DUES ARE NOT EXCESSIVE - \$9.00 PER $\frac{1}{2}$ YEAR PAYABLE JANUARY 1ST AND AGAIN JUNE 30TH OF EACH YEAR OR ON A YEARLY BASIS OF \$18.00 EITHER ON THE ABOVE SEMI-ANNUAL DATES. MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE FAIRMONT LIONS CLUB AND EITHER BRING OR MAIL IT TO LION CLARENCE BROCK - 144 BROADVIEW AVENUE, FAIRMONT.

MAYBE A CHANGE:

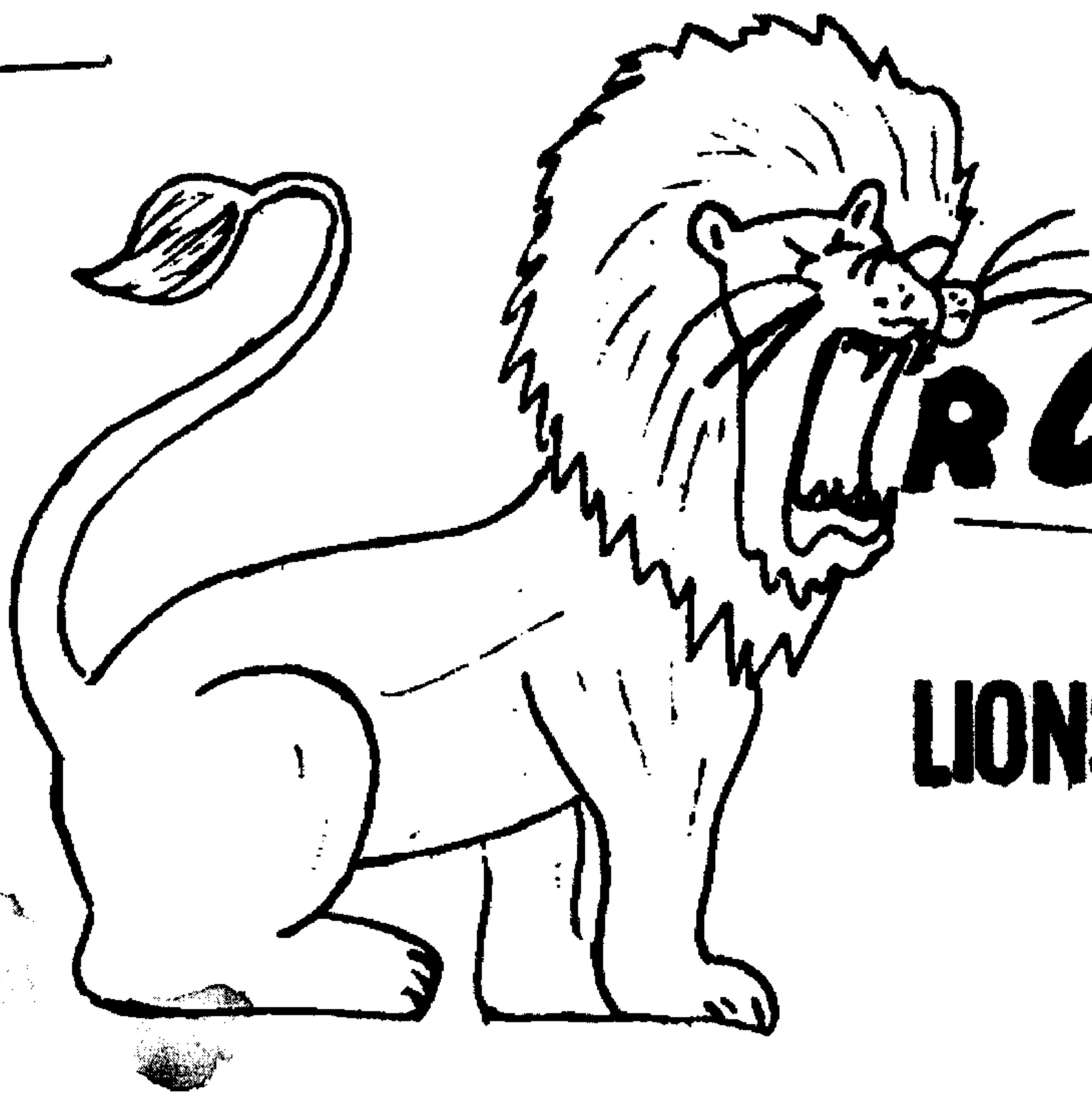

SIGHT CONSERVATION

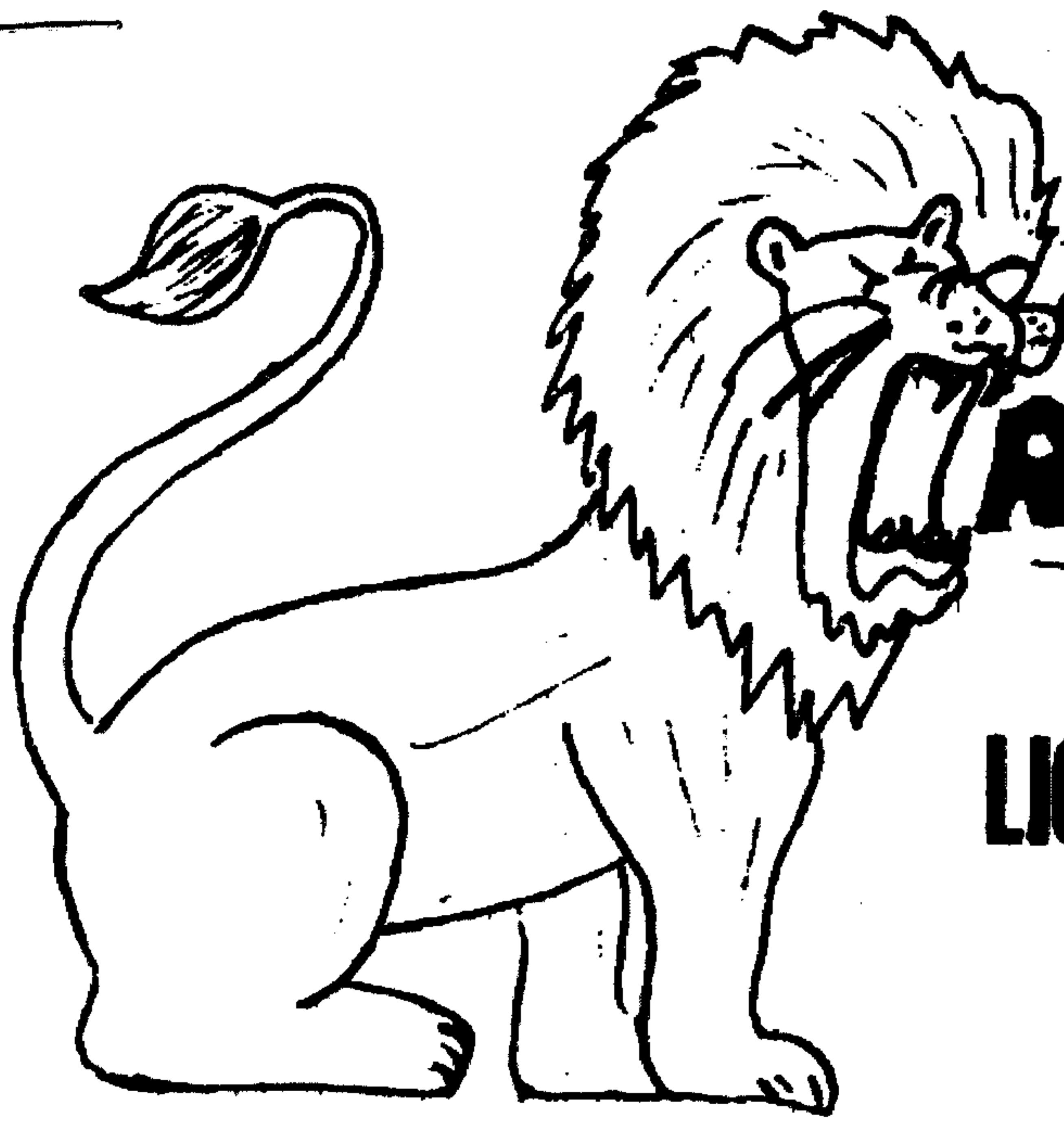
