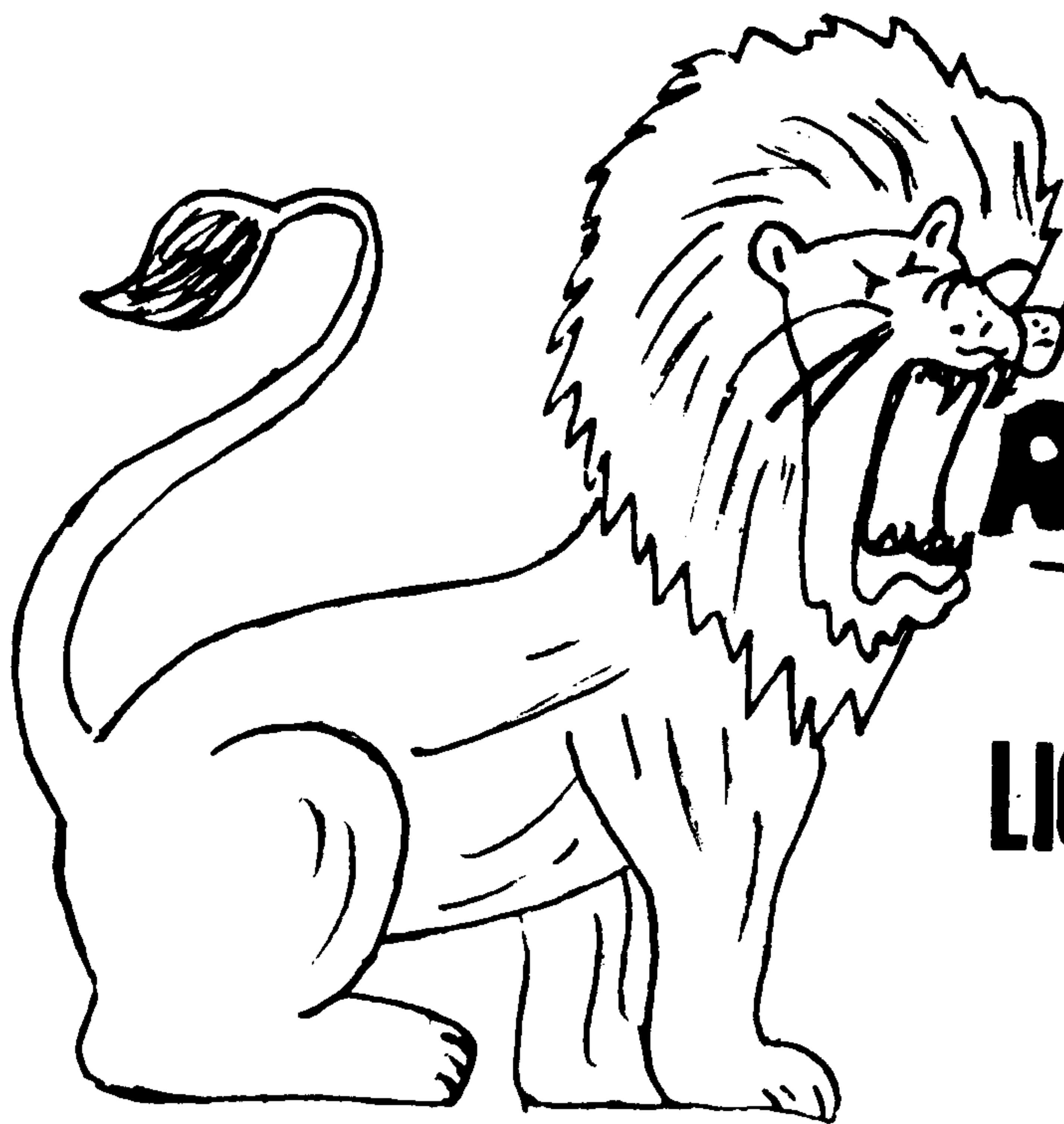

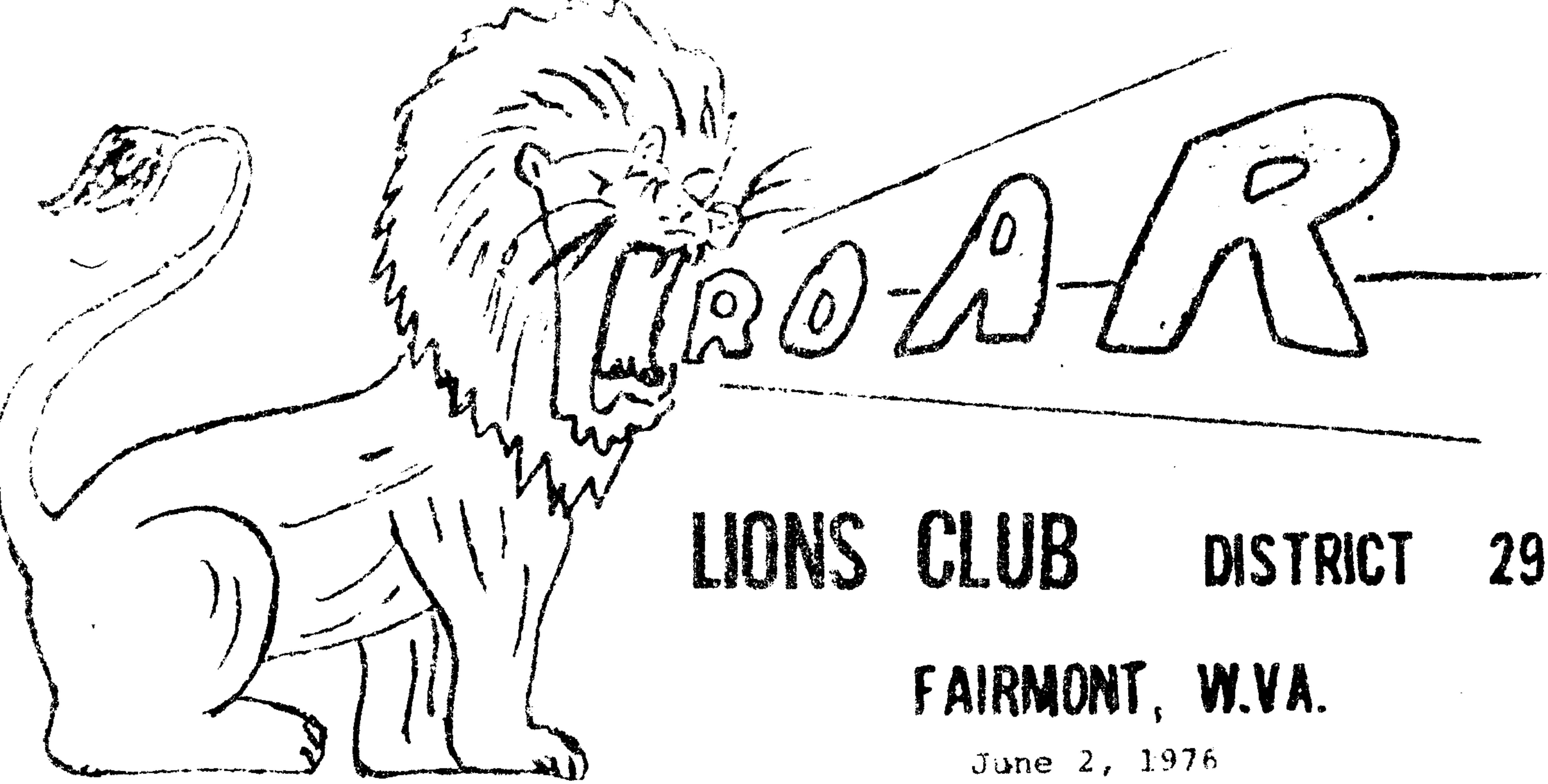
**ANNOUNCEMENTS:**
