Plans are underway for a Peach Sale fund raiser to be held in August, according to Bob Brumage. He is working on the necessary arrangements and more information will be forthcoming.


## Club Continues Meeting Need for Eyeglasses

These individuals will be seen by the optometrist and receive prescription eyewear as required. During the past club year, the Fairmont Lions Club spent \$2,440 for exams and glasses for the less fortunate of Fairmont.

In addition to providing eye exams and glasses, the club is able to arrange for advanced eye care services, including cataract surgery, through our WV Lions Sight Foundation. The Eyeglass Committee approves and submits the application to the Foundation which arranges for the needed care. The club makes an annual contribution to the Foundation to support this work.

Fairmont Lions Club Supports Two Guide Dog Schools

For several years, the Fairmont Lions Club has provided \$300 annually to two guide dog schools, \$150 each to Pilot Dogs, Inc. of Columbus, OH and Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester, MI. Both schools have provided guide dogs to blind individuals within West Virginia over the years and both provide the dog, training, room and board, as well as transportation to and from the school at no cost to the student.

Pilot Dogs was chartered as a non-profit organization in 1950. In 1960, Pilot Dogs became a state project of the Ohio Lions and is now supported by over 500 Lions Clubs. In 1950, four people were trained. Today, Pilot Dogs serves approximately 150 every year.

Leader Dogs for the Blind was founded by three Detroit area Lions Club members in 1939. They provide dogs to about 270 students each year. Leader Dogs received the personal endorsement of Melvin Jones (Founder of Lionism) in 1958. Lions Clubs throughout the world have provided support. Training for a blind individual takes just under a month at

either school. A guide dog provides a level of independance and safety for the blind person, allowing that person to navigate streets, shopping centers, businesses and more.

**Lions Helping Hurricane Irene Victims** 

Lions Clubs International Foundation is mobilizing \$90,000 to provide immediate disaster relief in the wake of Hurricane Irene. LCIF Chairperson Sid Scruggs worked with local Lions to purchase 600 cases of bleach that residents need to disinfect their water wells and to clean their flooded homes. In North Carolina, Lions distributed relief kits that included bleach, detergent, rubber gloves, garbage bags and cleaning supplies.

"After two feet of water flooded homes in Columbia, there is now a long clean-up LCIF Chairperson Sid Scruggs process ahead," said Chairperson Scruggs. "It is rewarding to know that we are providing them with a little hope and help during this difficult time."

In 1955, Lions Leonard Jarrett and Jason Conley traveled to Lions Clubs soliciting support for a state-wide organization and the Lions Sight Program of WV was chartered. This operated mainly in the Kanawha Valley area, but in 1959, the West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation was formed and the two programs merged. The Foundation now provides eye and hearing surgery, hearing aids, artificial eyes, and the Mobile Eye Screening Unit, among other services.




## **Don Downs Speaks to Club**
