
Lions Volunteer for the Multiphasic Screening



At the July 28th meeting our program was given by Steve Finn, Executive Director of the Chestnut Mountain Ranch. The Ranch is a Non-Profit, Christ centered, safe haven for boys and families in crisis. It is a place for family restoration, where boys can enjoy school again, and all can experience family values. Their team is in the process of building 7 homes on their newly acquired property to keep the boys in a positive environment when home life is not providing a nurturing environment. Mr. Finn and his family have purchased the land and begun construction on the first of 7 homes. Much work is yet to be done. West Virginia has one of the nations highestrates of child abuse and neglect. The government cost for housing youth in the division of Juvenile Services in West Virginia is \$90,000 a year. There is certainly a need for an alternative answer to helping these young men. Mr. Finn is absolutely committed to making sure we have that choice in our state.




Ten Members have Perfect Attendance

Kim Cummings of the Marion County Literacy Volunteers Visits Fairmont Club

On September 13th, Kim Cummings, Director of the Marion County Literacy Volunteers addressed the Fairmont Lions Club. She explained that adult literacy is a growing concern in our community. It is estimated that 1 in 5 adults cannot read above a 4th grade level. This is not just a Marion County problem. Ms. Cummings also stated that over one half of the work force, 90 million adults are less educated than the previous generation.

To address this startling problem, there are Literacy Volunteer organizations in just about every community. Our Marion County Volunteers train in several different areas; Skills Assessments, Tutoring for GED, Head Start readyness, after school reading programs and one on one adult reading assistance.

Those who wish to participate in this vital program can contact the Literacy Volunteer office at 601 Locust Ave. There are various training sessions available to receive the necessary skills to help your group of choice.

Literacy is a key component in achieving a quality of life that not only improves an individual life, but also improves the entire community that we live in.

The proceeds are used to purchase research materials and equipment for the West Virginia University Eye Center. They also purchase all of the screening equipment that travels around our state to screen children and adults who do not get regular eye screenings included in their medical insurance coverage.

The largest fundraiser for the foundation is the Dan Dague Car Show held on Labor Day Monday each year for the past 11 years. Past DG Jeff works tirelessly to insure that this event is staffed and planned to yield a successful fundraising event.

Even with the rain date delay re-schedule, we had over 500 entries for the show, and raised in excess of \$10,000.00. Our goal this year is \$40,000, for the SL9 Hand Held eye screener equipment that can screen infants as young as 6 months old to detect problems with vision before they go to school. Some problems can be treated more successfully if diagnosed even earlier than the 4 to 5 year olds who typically get their first vision screening.

Journey for Sight Raises \$544.00

On September 15th, 2012, our Annual Journey for Sight was held to raise funds to assist with the payment of eye glasses and exams for Fairmont Residents. Stations were set up at two points on the Rail Trail. One station is set just before the tunnel beside of the Novelis Plant on East Side. The other station is on the Pricketts fort side. Sponsored Journey participants recieved refreshments at both stations. Between donations from Saturday walkers and bikers, and sponsored funds, the Club raised \$544.00. This was another successful fundraiser for our club.
