**Trail Cleaned by Lions** 

President Guy Ward was joined by Aletta and Bob Moffett to clean the West Fork River Ralph S Larue Trail between Monongah and Norway on Sunday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>. It took about an hour and a half to get the job done. Several cyclists and walkers met along the trail expressed appreciation for the club's efforts.

The club's Adopt-A-Trail program is part of the Centennial Service Challenge for Lions to Serve 100 million people in several areas of service.

The club picks up litter four times during the trail season. Watch for the next trail clean-up likely to be scheduled in October.

Typhoon Soudelor tore through the Pacific Ocean earlier this month. It claimed dozens of lives and millions of families are without water, electricity or shelter. The storm caused monsoon rains, high winds, flooding and landslides.

LCIF responded immediately with a \$10,000 Emergency grant to the Lions of Micronesia for relief efforts in Saipan. A \$200,000 Major Catastrophe grant is being used to assist the Lions of Taiwan with immediate needs and long-term reconstruction.

#### Past International Director Fred D. Cole

Fred D. Cole Sr. passed away August 17th. A Wheeling resident, he was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the 73rd International Convention in 1990. Past Director Cole was a retired insurance agent and had spent a tour of duty in the United States Marine Corps. He was the recipient of many awards, including 100% District Governor Award, serving as district governor in 1980-81. He also received the International President's Award and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor granted by the association to its members. Fred was a Melvin Jones Fellow.

In 1993, Fred chaired the USA/Canada Leadership Forum in Winston-Salem, NC and was instrumental in establishing the WV Lions Leadership School.

He was married to Mary Louise and had three children and five grand-children. Fred was a good friend to many and contributed greatly to the success of the Lions in West Virginia and to the association. We will miss him.




