

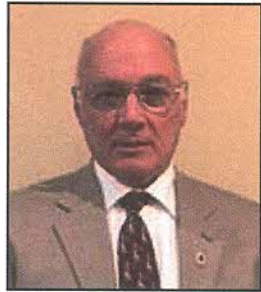

Club to Host Joint District Governor Visit
District Governor Bill Syphers will address Lions at a joint meeting of Barrackville, Rivesville and Fairmont Lions Clubs at Mom's Place, 6:30 pm, Thursday, August 8, 2019. The meeting is hosted by the Fairmont Lions Club. Mom's will have a buffet dinner set up for this meeting. DG Syphers will speak about the theme and program of Lions Clubs International President Dr. Jung-Yul Choi as well as his own goals and plans for District 29L. Plan now to attend this annual opportunity to meet and hear from our district governor.

Club Eligible for LCI Service Grant

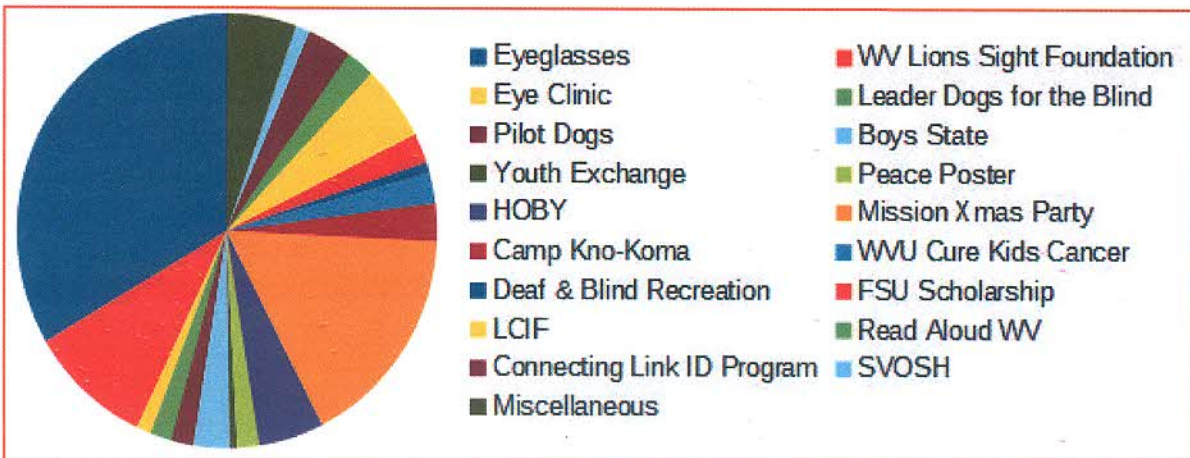
Pres. Bob Moffett received communication from Lions Clubs International to inform the club that it is eligible to receive a service grant for reporting a new member between April and the end of June. The grant may be requested for a service project designed to engage new members in service. The amount of the grant will be equal to the entrance fees collected.

Budget adopted for 2019-2020 Service

The club's administrative budget is tied closely to member dues and tail twister receipts. Administrative costs for the 2019-2020 year are projected to be slightly under \$3,000.

The club's activities budget is funds used to support our motto, "We Serve" and come from all funds collected from the public through fundraisers and donations. Since the district-wide car show supporting the WV Lions Sight Foundation has been discontinued, the club voted to add what had gone to the show directly to the club's support for the Sight Foundation. The Foundation makes it possible for the club to secure cataract surgery for those without the means to pay. The club also voted to add WVU Cure Kids Cancer fund to support Lions Clubs International's new focus on pediatric cancer and to support SVOSH, the student chapter of Volunteer Optometric Services to Humanity located at Southern College of Optometry in Memphis, TN. The club has supported students volunteering to provide eye care on four day mission trips coordinated by local Lions clubs in host countries in the past.

The chart below shows where the funds have been allocated for the coming year. A detailed listing of amounts is found on page 2. Adjustments to the budget may be made as needed throughout the year.

Rail-Trail Clean-Up in August



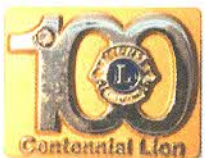
Fairmont Lions Club members clean trash from the West Fork River Ralph S. LaRue Trail several times each season.

Club Receives \$6,000 Grant

The Fairmont Lions Club has received a grant of \$6,000 to be used for the club's purchase of a Plusoptix vision screener. It should be noted that this grant is just under the amount spent by the club towards all service during the 2018-2019 club year. Club president Bob Moffett attended a ceremony in the WesBanco Bank Fairmont Boardroom on August 9th, along with representatives from other grant recipient organizations. The grant was awarded in the memory of Frances B. Bowers and the George W. Bowers Family Charitable Trust.

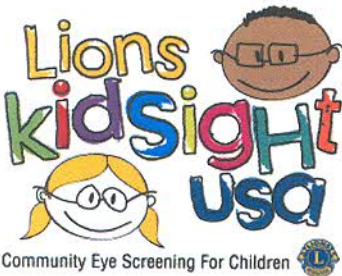
The vision screener is a state-of-the-art device developed for the early detection of the most prevalent vision disorders in children. The Fairmont Lions Club began screening children at child development centers and day care facilities in the spring of 2016 and for three years has also screened children at the Marion Co. Board of Education's Family Literacy Fair. During that time, the club has screened 711 children of whom 189 were referred for further examination. Club members volunteered 118 person-hours to conduct these screenings. These screenings were performed with equipment

provided to Lions District 29L by the WV Lions Sight Foundation and the WVU Eye Institute/Cheat Lake Lions Club. Considerable travel time and logistics were involved. The new screener will be available for the club to use as needed and will also be made available to the Barrackville and Rivesville Lions clubs, which are nearby.

Bob Brummage, treasurer, suggested the club apply and provided some of the required documentation while Bob Moffett, secretary, put together screening data and completed and submitted the grant proposal once the club approved a motion at the April 11th meeting to submit the proposal.

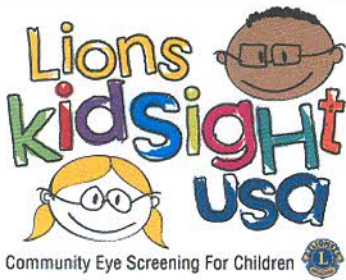

Club Awards Peace Poster Winners
Gabriella Mugnano, a 7th grade student at Fairmont Catholic School, and Cody McCale, a 7th grade student at East Fairmont Middle School have each taken the first step to becoming an internationally recognized artist by winning a local competition sponsored by the Fairmont Lions Club.

Mugnano's and McCale's posters were among more than 450,000 entries submitted worldwide in the annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. Lions Clubs International is sponsoring the program to emphasize the importance of world peace to young people everywhere.

"Peace is something that won't come together in one day, but we have to work for it," Cody McCale said. Gabriella Mugnano stated, "Peace doesn't come from violence, it comes from the kindness within us." Their posters were selected for originality, artistic merit, and portrayal of the contest theme, "Journey of Peace."

Bob Brummage and Bob Moffett presented a certificate and a Walmart gift card to each 1st & 2nd place winner in recognition of their artistic accomplishments.

Apple Sale A Success

On Friday, October 18, Bob Brummage headed into the mountains of West Virginia and returned to Fairmont with a trailer-load of apples for the Lions club to sell. By 8:00 am on a foggy and brisk Saturday, the apples were being sold in front of Learning Land Day Care & Preschool. The sale was scheduled to last until 2:30 pm, but with only a few bags left, the sale closed down and Brummage headed home. Before he made it home, all of the remaining apples were sold.

In addition to 65 bushels of apples, the club sold 18 half-gallons of apple cider, also from the orchard where the apples were obtained, and 18 jars of apple butter. The event amounted to sales of approximately \$1950 from apples and cider and \$150 from brooms

and mops — total proceeds of about \$2100.

Children's Eye Screening Events Offered By Club

Eye screening began at Bumble Bear corner September 23rd and continued through October at East Fairmont Early Head Start, Kids R Us (on two days), and Fritz's Rug Ratz. Participating Lions were Aletta Moffett, Bob Brummage and Bob Moffett. A total of 108 children were screened at these facilities with 6 being referred for a professional eye exam. These events involved a total of 14 volunteer hours.



Additional child care facilities will be visited in the spring and the club will be contacting the Marion Co. Board of Education to encourage screening in area schools.



Any Lion who would like to help with future screenings may be quickly trained on the club's new Plusoptix equipment to become a Certified Vision Screener.

The club provides \$20 to be used toward each child's gifts. Eyeglasses Assistance

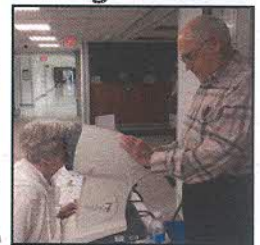
Nine individuals received eye exams and glasses from the Fairmont Lions Club during October and November.
