



Club Meeting Virtually Again
The Fairmont Lions Club has gone back to meeting by way of emails and phone calls as the number of cases of COVID-19 has again increased in West Virginia. Until it is safe to meet in-person, club business meetings will be held once each month.

Twelve members took part in the August meeting which took place from August 11-13 by email and phone. At the meeting, the club approved up

to 10 applications for eye exams and glasses for August.

A recommendation was made and approved to hold the next and final Adopt-A-Trail trash pick-up in late September or early October. Bob Moffett will contact the area schools about the Lions Peace Poster Contest once schools are in session in September. Kits will be ordered based on the ability and willingness of schools to take part during the current circumstances.

"Feel Good Meals" Offered by DAC

Fairmont's Disability Action Center has offered meeting space and a meal for club meetings at the DAC. As a plus, the location is closer to many of our members. On the downside, only cold foods, wraps and salads, are on the menu. The cost would be \$12.00 per meal and we would need to have a count to them in advance of each meeting. It is something for members to consider, once we are able to resume in-person meetings.

> Club Needs Space for Broom Inventory The club needs to locate a storage space for our broom and mop inventory as S&M Glass is no longer in business. On August 18, Bob Brummage, Aletta Moffett and Bob Moffett removed all inventory from the S&M Glass building and moved it to a short-term storage in a rental storage space being shared with and offered by Bob and Lois Brummage. Two pickup trucks were able to move the unsold merchandise. Sales are currently limited due to the business operations during the pandemic by some of the retailers that sell for us. The

club is transferring some inventory to the Moundsville Lions Club, which will see fundraising income of \$262.98 when Pres. Bob Moffett meets PDG Eugene Saunders on Tuesday, August 25th to transfer

the brooms.

The temporary storage facility will only be available to the club for a short time. If anyone has an idea where brooms could be delivered and stored, please let Bob Brummage or Bob Moffett know. The club must find


new space soon!

donation made it possible for William to gain his independence from blindness." He received orientation and mobility training (how to navigate with a white cane) and later returned for Leader Dog Rio. "They let Rio off the leash...he jumped up in my arms and he assured me everything will be fine." Leader Dog gave William the skills to regain his confidence. Fairmont Lions Club Funds Project ID

For Several years, the Fairmont Lions Club has donated \$300 to fund a project to provide West Virginia identification cards to the disadvantaged. An official ID is often required to obtain housing, a driver's license to get a job and other available services. If the person in need was born outside of West Virginia, it can be quite expensive to obtain an official birth certificate which is required for the ID. Our donation makes it possible to get the birth certificate or documents required and can mean a place to live or a job. Connecting Link works to obtain the documents for their clients.

Christmas Parade & Party Canceled Due to COVID-19 and its risk to the community and to parade participants, as well as volunteers lining-up the parade, the Fairmont Lions Club decided to cancel this year's Christmas parade. Alternative on-line activities for children will be considered.

The Union Mission does not wish to have a large Christmas gathering this year, so the club, working with the Mission, will attempt to provide gifts for children, but without the usual party.
