Awards Presented

As part of the Fairmont Lions Club's 100th Anniversary Celebration, the club presented Dr. Martin Carpenter and Dr. Philip Wilmoth of Fairmont Eye Care, Inc., each with a Leonard Jarrett Award. Leonard Jarrett is recognized as the founder of the West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation and he knew from personal experience the financial expenses of eye care and surgery. In 1984 the Foundation established the Leonard Jarrett Award, the highest honor given

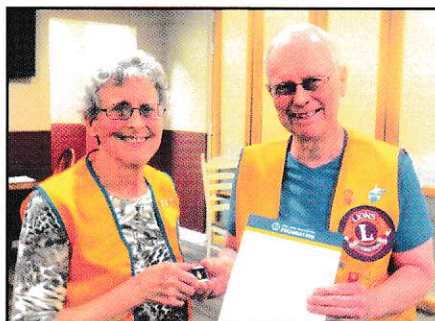
by the West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation. Donations to the Foundation, which can assist Lions clubs throughout West Virginia with providing eye surgeries to those in need, were made by the club in the names of Dr. Carpenter and Dr. Wilmoth. Although the doctors were unable to attend the club's anniversary dinner to receive their awards, Fairmont Lions Club Pres. Bob Brummage, Eyeglasses Chairperson Keith Long and Secretary Bob Moffett went to Fairmont Eye Care to make the presentations. Dr. Carpenter and Dr. Wilmoth have provided much guidance and assistance to the club for many years with the club's program of providing eye exams and eyeglasses to those with financial need and the Fairmont Lions Club wished to recognize them for their valuable assistance.

Also recognized at Fairmont Eye Care was club member Keith Long, chairperson of the club's Eyeglasses Committee. The Fairmont Lions Club presented him with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. Melvin Jones is considered the founder of Lions Clubs International. The club donated to the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) in the name of Keith Long. LCIF is the charitable arm of Lions Clubs International, which provides grant

funding to support the compassionate works of Lions, empowering their service and addressing needs locally and globally. The Foundation has recently provided financial support for earthquake relief in Kentucky and Turkey, assisted with relocating refugees from Ukraine, and provided funds to build a new facility in Brazil focused on vocational training for people with hearing disabilities. In past years, LCIF grants have helped West Virginia Lions provide flood relief around the state and other vital services.

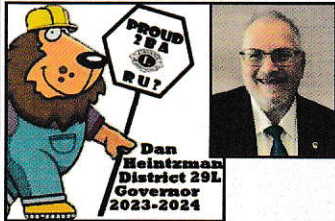

Volunteers Clean Different Section of West Fork River Trail

After many years of cleaning trash along the West Fork River Trail between Fairmont (Norway trailhead) and Monongah, on Saturday, June 17, four Lions and an additional volunteer moved to the section of trail between Monongah and the Everson Bridge trailhead. The Monongah to Fairmont section is staying much cleaner than when the club first took it on

and that allowed us to work on the next section, cleaning a total of nearly four miles this season. The plan is to alternate sections each time the trail is cleaned. Those on the trail were Debra Benedict, Virginia Gallion's sister-in-law, Virginia Gallion, Pres. Bob Brummage, Aletta Moffett and Bob Moffett. Each section is close to the same length and involves about 2 hours on the trail for each volunteer. In addition to picking up litter, low-hanging branches were cut back to not interfere with bicycle riders on the trail. MCPARC picks up the bags of trash collected and have expressed appreciation for the club's efforts in maintaining the trail.

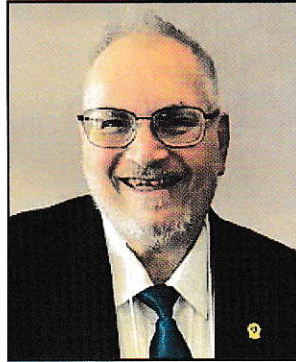

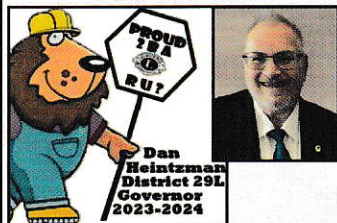
Club Dues Paid

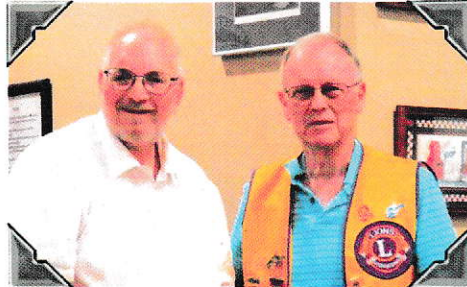

DG Dan Heintzman Visits Club
 District Governor Daniel Heintzman made his official visit to the Fairmont Lions Club on Thursday, September 14th. After being introduced by Pres. He talked about Lions "Mission 1.5," a plan to achieve world-wide Lions membership of 1.5 million Lions by July 1, 2027. He suggested possibilities for starting club branches with only five members needed. District 29L lost six clubs in two years, but two of those have been reorganized. He was pleased that a new Leo Club has been formed at Paden City High School.

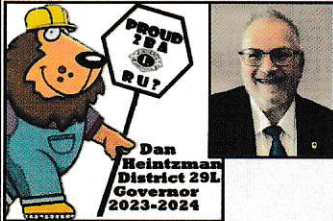
Peaches Good Return on Investment

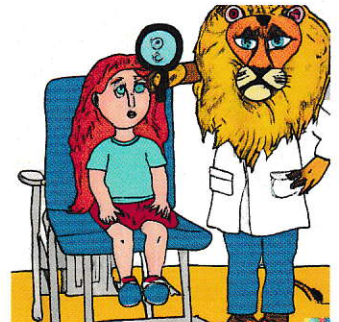

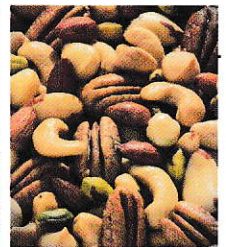

Adopt-A-Trail Completes Season



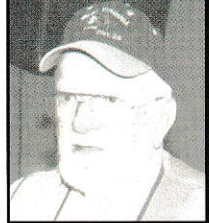

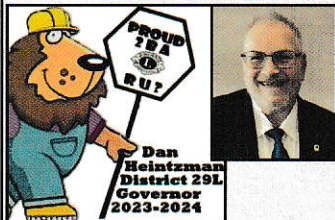

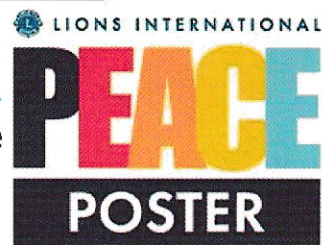
