Lion Judy gave the benediction.

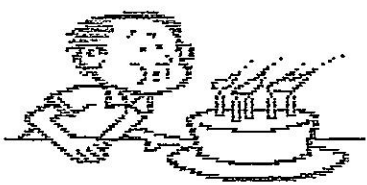
 A new year is beginning. We have a new slate of officers. We have problems that need to be solved. It behooves all of us to get behind our leaders and strive to solve our problems.
