In addition, the club sponsors youth to attend Mountaineer Boys State and the Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Seminars; provides scholarships for college and sponsors the Lions Peace Poster Contest in schools. We take part in the Lions Reading Action Program knowing that education is the key to success.

Recreational programs including skiing, bowling and pizza parties, and funding for a student work program for the children at the Romney Schools for the Deaf and Blind are supported by our club.
